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Disability as diversity: The inclusion of students with disabilities in higher education Edu4ALL

WHAT IS Edu4ALL PROJECT

Edu4All is a three years project started on November 15, 2020, and funded by the European Union through Erasmus+ programme CBHE.

Edu4ALL aims at supporting the inclusion of students with disabilities in HE by establishing an “Inclusive Education Unit” that follows the international standards with the objective of equality in Education, Activities, and Services. We target students who are blind or low vision, deaf or hard of hearing, or those who have motor disability. To achieve the general aim of the project, four sub-aims are identified: reaching the target students to increase their participations in university programs, professional development for staff to teach and to serve those students, equitable access to a high-quality education, and maintaining sustainability.

- To raise the awareness about the inclusive education among students with disabilities.
- To build the capacity of staff to teach and to serve students with disabilities through professional development.
- To improve the level of competencies and skills of staff at PC HEIs by
 - (i) training visits for staff to EU partners to modernize Inclusive Education expertise in innovative learning
 - (ii) providing research collaboration opportunities with EU staff through joint supervision of students' projects.
- To support students with disabilities in HE.
- To establish the Inclusive Education Unit at PC HEIs.
- To modernise the disability statement at PC HEIs.
- To modernise laboratories at PC HEIs equipped with the needed assistive technologies to be used for teaching and research.
- To enhance equality in education by including students with disabilities in university programs
- To empower people with disabilities and prepare them for future careers.
- To create opportunities of collaboration between academia and industry.
- To develop training tutorials for faculty and staff that are compatible with the best EU practice guides in order to be used for staff training.
- To gain the required experience in defining the quality framework for the project, and implementing project quality assurance control plan.




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Edu4ALL kick-off meeting- Online via Zoom

Jan. 18-19 2021



Work package leaders presented in detail the specific objectives, the work plan, the expected deliverables and indicators of each work package. Project partners agreed on the key management issues. Project committees formed. Communication channels and platforms chosen. Project evaluation procedures presented by Dr. Eman Daraghmi, project manager. Dr. Yousef Daraghmi came through financial issues, regulations, and policies. Tentative schedule of upcoming events discussed and agreed on. Partners emphasized on the humanity perspective of the project and its noble goals. They stressed the importance of increasing project visibility even among people with disability through the proper maintenance of assistive technology. A follow up meeting held by PTUK virtually via Zoom platform. All regional partners from both Palestine and Jordan attended the meeting including Palestine Technical College, Al Umma University College, University of Jordan, Irbid National University, and Partners for Sustainable Development. Dr. Eman Daraghmi, project coordinator, managed and coordinated the meeting. She made a brief description of Edu4ALL project progress, stressed the key accomplishments and the already completed tasks. About the next step. Dr. Daraghmi focused on finalizing the already accomplished tasks by preparing the required deliverables according to the adopted quality plan. And to enrich Edu4ALL Website with content reflecting project progress. Dr. Daraghmi discussed the importance of preparing for an awareness workshop in both Palestine and Jordan. Dr. Yousef Awwad, from PTUK, discussed the financial issues of the project. He presented the monetary forms and reports to be filled by all partners. And showed how to prepare those documents in a professional way. Further, Dr. Awwad, discussed the equipment preparation, showed samples of prepared lists and urged all partners to review their lists and submit the final version within five days. At the meeting, Dr. Ismail Altaharwa explained the aim of the Edu4ALL project and discussed with the group several issues related to the implementation of the project such as the best location of the accessibility unit and the committee members that will supervise the unit as well as the sustainability of the project after the end of the funding.



Team project meeting at PTC, PTC - Gaza, Jun. 12th 2021

The Edu4all project team at Palestine Technical College - Deir El-Balah (PTC) met to discuss the progress of the project and the practical steps to admit deaf students in the college's academic programs in the first semester, which will start next September. The team will coordinate with the Ministry of Education and specialized deaf schools to implement this goal so PTC becomes a diversified place for students with different needs. Moreover, the members of the team who will attend the project management meeting in August were nominated.



UPV/EHU participating in project's Quality assurance

UPV/EHU - Basque

Since the beginning of the project, the UPV/EHU members have been working on different tasks mainly related to quality assurance work package, but also in the preparation and the dissemination and exploitation packages of the project. These activities include the development of deliverable D3.1 "Defining the quality framework for the project". The development of this deliverable was one of the key pillars of the project, as its objective is to define a Quality Plan to facilitate the project's management and guide all partners on the evaluation and quality issues, establishing a coherent set of guidelines by which all aspects of the project are managed and measured



An essential component of D3.1 deliverable was the development of the Document Templates used to draft the expected documents (deliverable/WP result), and the Project Quality Assessment Forms, which provide indicators relevant to the quality of the project management, coordination, structure, support mechanisms, content, and resources.





Fields visit to Universities in Gaza Strip by PTC team

PTC - Gaza, Feb. 26th 2021

Edu4All project team at Palestine Technical College Deir El-Balah (PTC) visited a number of higher education institutions in the Gaza Strip - Palestine that provide services to the disabled students, in order to be aware of the latest efforts of these institutions and to learn about the challenges they face. The visits included the center for the education of the disabled at the University College of Applied Sciences (UCAS) and the Center for Disability and Inclusion Services at the Islamic University of Gaza. The project team met with the staff at the center for the education of the disabled at the University College, headed by the Head of the Rehabilitation Department, Dr. Salah Saleh and head of the Center for Education with Disabilities a. Ibrahim Eslim and discussed ways of joint cooperation to achieve the goal of the project, which is the integration of students with disability in higher education. Moreover, the project team met with the administration of the Center for Disability and Inclusion Services at the Islamic University of Gaza (IUG), headed by the director of the center, Mr. Bahaa Sarhan and center coordinator Dr. Hassan Abu Al-Amreen and discussed ways of joint cooperation to achieve the goal of the project, which is the integration of students with disability in higher education. The project team was briefed on the devices used in the center that serve the visually and hearing impaired, and it was agreed to work on a framework for future coordination between PTC and the IUG. Further field visits by PTC team to other HE institutes at the Gaza Strip to learn about experiences in integrating students with disability in the HEIs.



Edu4ALL – Second Management Meeting in UJ-Aqaba

UJ - Aqaba, Jul. 28th-30th 2021

Edu4ALL management meeting was held both physically in UJ, Aqaba, Jordan, and virtually by Zoom from the 28th to 30th of July 2021. Dr. Muath Abu Faraj, Dean of Information Technology and Systems faculty in the University of Jordan - Aqaba campus, opened the meeting by welcoming all partners. He appreciated the role of Erasmus+ programme and projects to support the remote areas and the minorities within the local community. Participants have presented their contributions to the project. All work packages were discussed. The progress of the project was reviewed and the plan for the next six months was discussed and approved. Partners agreed on reviewing some deliverables and modifying them. Two capacity building meetings and one management meeting were planned.

PTUK - Tulkarm, May. 20th 2021



Athens Development Training


NKUA - Athens, Oct 18th - 22nd 2021

The National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA) organized and hosted intensive training for all project partners from the 18th till the 22nd of October 2021 in Athens, Greece. The main theme of the training was the professional development and capacity building of partner country staff under inclusive education theme.

Assistive Technology Definition and Tools

Assistive Technology Definition

- Technology related Assistance for individuals with disabilities
- Assistive technologies are equipments, items or devices used to improve or keep functionality of an individual with a disability. This will allow an individual with a disability to be more independent in life, this includes: education, recreation, and any daily activity.

Augmentation and Alternative Communication (AAC) software

AAC software helps someone with speech or language impairment to communicate. It enables them to have voice, control their environment and live more independent lives.



Tactile graphics maker

Also called Picture in a Flash (PIAF)

Can a picture be touched? Can touch see a picture. Images and graphics help understand what is difficult to be described by words. Images rise and are ready in an instant. Draw, print or copy pictures onto the Piaf swell paper and pass it through the Piaf and all the black lines and shapes swell to create a drawing that can be read with the fingers.



Adaptive Switches

Access devices that allow movement-limiting disabilities to use technology and operate electronic devices. Instead of performing complex actions such as turning a knob, adaptive switches offer easier movement solutions, such as pressing a button, move mouse pointer or pressing mouse button.



Braille Embosser

Is an impact printer that renders text as tactile Braille cells. Using Braille translation software, a document or a digital text can be embossed with relative ease. This makes Braille production efficient and cost-effective.



Referable Braille Display

Is an electro-mechanical device for displaying characters, usually by round-tipped pins raised through holes in a flat surface. Visually impaired computer users who cannot use a standard computer monitor can use it to read text output.
